The Shriner Spotlight Award

From Shriners International (Imperial Shriners), we recently learned that Noble Merv Moxley, was named recipient of the Shriner Spotlight Award for Winter 2017-2018. The award is presented in recognition of his outstanding dedication to both the fraternity and its philanthropy.

In October of 1949, Illustrious Sir Moxley joined the Beaver Iconic Lodge, where he is still a member. In July of 1951, he joined Khartum Shriners, and became a member of the Oriental Band later that year. By 1958, Moxley and a few other Shriners who were interested in riding instead of walking had started the Khartum Motor Patrol. A few years later, Moxley thought that the Potentate should have a Harley-Davidson escort in parades, and he, along with some of the members of the Motor Patrol approached the Potentate about starting the Khartum Cycle Escort. In 1972, Moxley was asked by Illustrious Sir Doug Stewart to join the Divan, and he became Potentate in 1981. Illustrious Sir Moxley carried out his duties proudly, representing Khartum Shriners in all of his travels. After his year was done, he joined the Past Potentates Association.

On October 29, 2017, Illustrious Sir Moxley celebrated his 100th birthday. He has been a Shriner for 66 years, is the oldest member of Khartum Shriners, and has the lowest membership number.



We thank Illustrious Sir Moxley for his contributions to Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children, and congratulate him on receiving the Shriner Spotlight Award.

Giving Day is a semi-annual event conducted by The Hudson's Bay Company Foundation. Shriners Hospitals for Children- Canada is one of the selected charities. The Shriners participate by selling the five dollar cards which offers a discount to HBC shoppers on Giving Day (April 6, 2018). As an added incentive the charity that sells the most cards receives an additional cash donation from the HBC Foundation.

In the past two years the Shriners have raised \$14,390 for the Hospital through this wonderful initiative.

Thank you to everyone who attended Polo Park to sell Bay Giving Day cards in April. One hundred and fifty cards were sold and a cheque for \$750 was sent to the Shriners Hospital in Montreal. The money will be put towards "Pawz for Kids", which is First Lady Judy Allard's fundraising project this year. It appears that only one other group was selling cards at the Polo Park location. If the Shrine volunteers sold more than the other group, then Khartum may raise an additional 30% of the sales generated by the promo cards.

There may be another opportunity in September to sell these cards again. At the moment we do not know the date but we would be pleased to recruit volunteers to participate again. History of the Ruff Riders

Discussions in July 1983 amongst a group of Nobles lead to a request for permission from the Potentate to form an All Terrain Cycle (ATC) motorized unit; through many months of meetings this "Power" unit of the Khartum Temple (Shrine) came into existence by approval of the Potentate in January 1984.

The unit's vehicle is a three wheeler all terrain cycle Honda Big Red. In 1989, the Ruff Riders had a membership of 30 with 24 Owner/Riders. The Unit competed in the Shrine Midwest conference in Fargo/Moorhead in its first year, 1984, and won the Championship in its class. Since then the Ruff Riders have participated in all major Khartum Temple Parade activities and have barnstormed numerous rural town fairs in Manitoba.

The members have contributed within their means to Khartum Temple's Charitable pursuits, the Shrine Hospital for Children and the Stop Burn Injuries Program.

From the outset, the Ruff Riders have involved their Ladies in all their parades, pilgrimages and social activities, hence the term "The Family Unit". In 1989, the Principle Officers were President Emil Solypa, Captain Logie Smellie.
