im Cain of Nashville, Tennessee, is currently serving his 11th year as a member of the Boards of Directors for Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. Cain was elected Imperial Potentate, part of the 12-member body that helps govern the Shriners fraternity, during the Shriners' 2018 Imperial Session – held in Daytona Beach, Florida, July 15 – July 19.

During his years as a member of the Board of Directors, he has served as chairman of the following committees: Salary, Personnel & Retirement; Planning; Clinical and Basic Research; Medical Affairs; Informational Services; Revenue Cycle; Fraternal Strategic Planning; Insurance; Oversight; Special Purpose Funds/Fundraising Evaluation; Time and Place; Emblems, Regalia and Jewels. He has also served on the Public Relations; Corporate Compliance; Budget; Investments; Masonic Relations; DeMolay; Mileage and Per Diem; and Protocol and Resolutions committees. In addition, he has been the Liaison Officer to the Boston, Cincinnati, Shreveport, Springfield and Tampa Boards of Governors for Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Cain was raised a Master Mason in John B. Garrett Lodge #711 in Nashville, and is a member of the Scottish Rite, York Rite, Quetzalcoatl and Royal Order of Scotland. He has been a member of Al Menah Shriners in Nashville since 1995, and served as Potentate in 2006.

Cain has held several positions within his temple, including Captain of the Motor Corps, Membership Committee Divan Liaison, and Chairman of both the Ringmasters Club and the Business Owner's Group. Cain was a member of Al Menah's Shriners Leadership Team from 2002 to 2006 and assisted in raising more than \$5 million for Shriners Hospitals for Children. He was also a charter member of the Tennessee East-West Football Classic Committee.

Cain served as President of the Tennessee Shrine Association in 2006, is a past Raban of Hillbilly Clan #151, and a life-member of the Cabiri Association. He is an associate member of Rizpah Shriners in Madisonville, Kentucky, El Hasa Shriners in Ashland, Kentucky, and Jericho Shriners in Kingsport, Tennessee. Cain was awarded the Honorary DeMolay Legion of Honor.

A former locomotive engineer, Cain worked for CSX Transportation for more than 42 years. He was a Community Affairs and Safety Officer, and a board member of the Tennessee Railroad Association. Cain spent three years as state coordinator of Tennessee Operation Lifesaver Inc., a nationally recognized program that educates the public about dangers at railroad grade crossings and around railroad properties. He also served as chairman of the board for Alabama Operation Lifesaver Inc. and Tennessee Operation Lifesaver Inc.

Cain and his wife, Patsy, celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in August 2017. They have two children, Janice and Jim Jr., and two grandchildren, Oakley and Paxton. Cain attends Forest Hills Baptist Church in Nashville.

NOTICE OF MOTION

MOTION

I Robert Kirby, hereby make the following Notice of Motion to be voted upon at the next Stated Meeting on December 06, 2018 regarding the Temple Dues Structure.

Whereas: Khartum Shriners have continuously seen a decline in membership by way of demits and suspension;

Whereas: Many members of our Shrine Temple have indicated that the Temple dues cannot continue to climb as a means of running our Temple at the cost of our Shriners;

Whereas: Our Philanthropy has a large number of members who have dedicated many years to the Shrine but are now in a position they can no longer keep up with the dues structure;

Whereas: Our Temple needs to focus on recruiting more members to support our great cause;

Whereas: Our Divan would rather focus on maintaining membership and making a little off a lot versus a lot of a little;

Be it Resolved that:

The Khartum Temple Dues shall remain at \$139.00 for 2019 as well as the "Per Capita and Hospital Dues" which have yet to be assessed for 2019, but in 2018 were \$6.30 Hospital and \$37.60 Per Capita in total of \$43.90 US Funds for all Shriners with the exception of the following:

Any retired Shriner over the age of 65 who has been an active member for more than five consecutive years in Khartum Shriner can request in writing to the Recorder to have his Temple portion of the dues reduced to \$100.00 plus the Per Capita and Hospital Dues;

Any retired Shriner permanently confined to a retirement village, nursing home or healthcare facility who wishes to remain a member of Khartum can request in writing to the Recorder to have his Temple portion of the dues reduced to \$25,99 plus the Per Capita and Hospital Dues;

Any new Noble joining the Khartum Shrine will pay a \$200.00 Initiation Fee which will include the first year Temple, Hospital and Per Capita Dues but the Noble will be responsible to purchase either a used or new Fez through the Office. If the Noble joins after July 1st of the calendar year, the first year's Temple dues will be pro-rated in the following year. (Ex. Noble joins July 1, 2018 - \$200.00 covers them to July 1st 2019 and they would be prorated from July 2nd to December 31, 2019. Using \$139.00 as an annual membership, they would only pay \$69.50 plus the 2019 Per Capita and Hospital for the remaining six months in 2019)

To off-set the large payment once per year, Khartum Shrine will allow equal monthly automatic payments to all members of Khartum Shrine beginning for 2019 calendar year and it will include the Initiation Fee. Any cases of insufficient funds for monthly withdrawal will result in a \$30.00 service charge back to the Noble.

§ 325.11 Election Regulations.

- (a) **Electioneering.** A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a résumé consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, Noble, or group of Nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) **Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) **Violation.** For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending Noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) **Notice.** At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

Hospital Report

our Khartum Shrine Patient Transportation Portfolio continues to be very busy getting our patients to their appointments. As of the end of August Khartum Shriners have provided for 188 patient visits and taken in 12 new patients at a cost of about \$207,800 which includes 1 medivac trip and 2 air ambulance trips.

Of the 188 Patient visits 123 (65%) Twin Cities, 61 (32%) Canada, 2 Boston, 1 Chicago and 1 Philadelphia. The patient visits from each area are; Lakehead Shrine Club 33 (3 new, Twin Cities 62, Canada 4), Dryden Shrine Club 3 (Canada), Lake of the Woods 12 (Canada), Winnipeg & Area 84 (6 new, Twin Cities 51, Canada 31, Chicago 1, Philadelphia 1), Interlake Shrine Club 2 (Canada), Selkirk Shrine Club 7 (2 new, Twin Cities 5 Canada 2), Brandon Shrine Club 3 (1 new, Twin Cities 6, Canada 5) and Pembina Valley 3 (Canada 1, Boston 2).

In 2017 Shriners Hospitals for Children provided care for 145,027 patients, including 59,253 new patients who now know the unique brand of hope and healing that can be found at a Shriners Hospital. The staff at Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to giving each patient their full attention to ensure the child receives the best care and resources available so that they can recover to the fullest extent possible and have a full productive life.

Statistics for the Shriners Hospitals for Children,

Canada for the first quarter (January To June) are; 2307 New Patient Referrals, 11148 Clinic visits, 570 Surgical Operations at Shriners Hospitals for Children, 62 Surgeries outside of Shriners, Average length of stay is 3.9 days with an average of 8.3 patients/day in hospital rooms and 782 "No Shows", patients who never kept their appointments for one reason or another without informing the Hospital. Shriners Hospital for Children, Canada is the 3rd busiest Shrine Hospital behind Mexico and Northern California.

In the last few months Khartum was offered 2 wheel chairs that were in like new condition. On my trips to the Board meetings I delivered these to the Shriners Hospital for Children Canada where they will be put to good use by patients.

I would like to acknowledge the family of Larry Wayne Welishen who donated a wheelchair van to Khartum Shriners. Mr. Welishen who was confined to a wheelchair passed away on June 26, 2018. As Khartum Shriners did not have a requirement for this vehicle we sold it with the proceeds going to the Patient Transportation Fund. Below is the cheque presentation from Jerry Vande of Gauthier Auto Group with the proceeds from the sale of the van and a photo of Larry at the Shrine Circus in the 1950's. I should also acknowledge Noble Kelly Eldridge and Grant Gillan's for assistance in arranging for the sale of the van.

Sospital Report - Continued

In May the Ladies of Khartum Circle of Friends Brunch raised \$4021.23 to go the Shriners Hospital for Children Canada "Pet Therapy Program". This program utilizes trained dogs which are brought into the hospital to help comfort and lift up the spirits of the patients confined to the hospital. Below is a picture of Don Thomson presenting the cheque on behalf of the Circle of Friends to Bill Miller Chairman of the Board of Directors Shriners Hospital for Children - Canada.



During the recent Imperial Council Annual Meetings held in Daytona Beach, Florida there was legislation on the agenda which will affect how 5 Shriners Hospitals for Children would operate in the future. The joint boards in conjunction with the Boards of Directors for these hospitals are working on a direction these will take. The Hospitals that are affected are Boston, Cincinnati, Spokane, Twin Cities and Tampa. Of these the Twin Cities will affect our patients the most. In discussion with members of their Board of Governors they recognize that changes will have to be made on how they conduct business. To that end they are looking at partnerships with other hospital facilities, using Telehealth and or setting up outpatient clinics. Whatever the outcome is the board of governors want to create the ability for the patients and families to continue having that "Shrine" experience and not just an office with 1 or 2 clinic rooms. This is not going to happen overnight but will come gradually over the next 6 months to 1 year. Medical care and treatment is changing around us and if Shriners want to continue to be a leader our medical centers will have to change the way we do things as well. Shriners Hospitals are looking to treat more Kids in more locations in a more cost effective manner.

In 2010 the Institute of Medicine's report on the future of Nursing recommended 80% of the nursing workforce have a bachelor of Science Degree or higher by 2020. Advances in science and increasing patient complexity have accelerated the need for nurses with skill and knowledge to manage a challenging and increasing diverse health care environment. Shriners Hospitals for Children supports this recommendation and presently;

- 22% of our direct care nurses hold advance certification in a specialty area. (The Shrine System Goal is 40%).
- 70% of our direct care nursing workforce has a bachelor or higher degree in nursing.
- Voluntary nurse turnover is 2%, well below the reported national average of 16%.
- 95% of our patients report satisfaction for overall inpatient and ambulatory surgical nursing care. (Press Gainey Survey)

Shriners Hospitals for Children is a Health Care System dedicated to improving the lives of children, by providing pediatric specialty care, conducting innovative research and offering outstanding educational programs for medical professionals. Children up to age 18 with Orthopedic conditions, Cleft Lip and Palate, Spinal Cord Injuries and Burns are eligible for care and receive all services in a family centered environment regardless of the family's ability to pay. 


s the 2018 parade season comes to an end we would like to congratulate all who participated this year.



Khartum Ruff Riders





he Shrine Fez bearing the name Khartum, so familiar to many people in Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario today, was relatively unknown until 1905 when Khartum Temple was introduced, established and chartered in

Winnipeg, Manitoba, through the efforts of members of the Masonic Order, Scottish and York Rites and the Shrine of North America. Thus, the name "Khartum", taken from the chief city in Sudan, became Temple No. 95 in the Shrine of North America and the fifth temple to be chartered in Canada.

As membership rapidly grew throughout the Shrine of North America, the Imperial Shrine officers recognized that Shriners had to have a mandate that would keep their membership united in a common purpose. Thus, in 1922, was established the <u>Shriners Hospitals for Children</u>, which to this date is known as the "World's Greatest Philanthropy". Its mandate was to set up and maintain a network of hospitals for treating children with orthopedic or burns injuries. In 1923, Khartum Shriners proudly sent their first three patients to the Twin Cities Shrine Hospital for Children for treatment at no cost to the children or their families.

In earlier years, as the membership of Khartum grew, meetings were held at several venues throughout Winnipeg. Before moving into its current premises, the Temple was located in the former Ashdown residence at 529 Wellington Crescent, noted for its prestigious charm, beauty, presence, location and historical significance.

In 1937, Khartum was given jurisdiction over the Lakehead and Northern Ontario areas, which extended the Temple's jurisdiction from the Saskatchewan border to approximately 120 miles east of Thunder Bay.

In 1949, the Winnipeg Unit of Shriners Hospital for Children was built and in operation shortly thereafter. This was the pride of Khartum and was, no doubt, one of the main reasons for its membership growth as loyal and committed members served and supported the Shrine philanthropy. With

the introduction of the Canadian universal medicare system, the Winnipeg Unit of Shriners Hospital for Children was turned over to the Manitoba government in 1977. Khartum also introduced the Stop Burns Injuries Program, which provides fire-

prevention educational services to school children as well as a public service to senior residences and other organizations interested in preventing burns injuries.

Our philanthropy has been further enhanced in Khartum through the recognition of children in need of our services with the introduction of the Khartum Patient Transportation Fund, which is a registered charity. The fund has enabled Khartum to triple its patient load of children requiring and needing our no-cost medical services.

We recognize and proudly salute the support received from our various Shrine units operating out of Winnipeg and our Shrine clubs outside the city. All members of these units and clubs stand proud and tall for the many contributions they make in terms of time, effort and resources to the Shrine of North America and to the communities, towns and cities they represent.

Over the past several years, many <u>fund-raising initiatives</u> have been introduced and well supported by hardworking and committed nobles and their ladies who assist our whole organization to fund general operations and to help children who cannot help themselves.

In 2000, the Temple moved into its new and permanent home at 1155 Wilkes Avenue in Winnipeg, where it services the needs of its members and offers <u>first-class facilities</u> to the public for meetings and other functions and events.

Khartum Shriners and their ladies remain fiercely proud of the contributions and services we provide through our obligations and commitment to what we believe is the "World's Greatest Philanthropy".

All Shriners are Masons, but not all Masons are Shriners.

Shriners International is a spin-off from Freemasonry, the oldest, largest and most widely known fraternity in the world. Freemasonry dates back hundreds of years to when stonemasons and other craftsmen gathered after work in shelter houses, or lodges. Over time, the members organized into Masonic guilds and the tools of their trade – the square and compass – became the symbol of their brotherhood.

Over time, Masonry evolved into an organization that began to accept members who were not craftsmen. Today, Masonry is built upon a foundation of improving character and strengthening communities, though the square and compass are still the symbols of the fraternal brotherhood.

When Shriners International was first founded in 1872, the organization built on the principles that guided Freemasonry, while adding an element of fun and ultimately, philanthropy, that set Shriners International apart. The two organizations are also structured similarly:

Shriners have temples; Masons have a Blue Lodge or Craft Lodge

Members of the Masonic lodges are required to learn about their fraternity and earn a series of Masonic degrees.

When a member has completed the third and final degree he becomes a Master Mason and is then eligible to become a Shriner.

Additional courses of Masonic study are available - these are known as the Scottish Rite and the York Rite.
