Teen Paralyzed in Humbolt Bus Crash Heading to U.S for Treatment

A young hockey player who was paralyzed in the Humboldt Broncos bus crash is heading to the United States for specialized spinal treatment.

Ryan Straschnitzki, who has been getting physiotherapy twice a day at Calgary's Foothills Medical Centre, is scheduled to board a medical flight Wednesday for Philadelphia, where he will continue his rehabilitation at the Shriners Hospital for Children.

"The Shriners reached out a couple of weeks ago," said Ryan's father, Tom Straschnitzki. "He offered to have the Shriners make Ryan a Shriners Kid so he could go

to Philly for spinal rehab there instead of staying here.

"It's a big time boost. He's very excited. It's fantastic news. We haven't been there but we've heard about it, so you've gotta try it."

The 19-year-old was paralyzed from the chest down when a bus carrying the Saskatchewan junior hockey team was in a collision with a semi-trailer on a rural highway April 6.

The Shriners launched America's first pediatric spinal cord injury rehabilitation program in 1983. They say their program includes a wide range of rehabilitation aimed at building strength, confidence and "independence to the fullest extent possible."

"They still have to assess when we get there. It's just better. There's more advanced technology than here," Tom Straschnitzki said.

"When the Shriners ask you and are going to do this for you, I don't think you say no."

A private plane, equipped with a paramedic and a nurse, will accompany Ryan and his father to Philadelphia. The Shriners are covering the cost of the trip and the treatment.

Straschnitzki said his son will be in Philadelphia for between six to eight weeks. His life is likely to change once again when he returns to Canada.

"He should be going home by then," his father said. "Once he can do it on his own, they'll send him home, and



then he'll do rehab here in Calgary."

Ryan Straschnitzki was badly hurt in the accident: he suffered a spinal injury, broken ribs, a broken collar bone, a punctured lung and bleeding in his head and pelvis.

The collision is still being investigated.

The Broncos were on their way to a playoff game. Sixteen people were killed and 13 were injured. RCMP have only said the truck was in the intersection when the crash occurred.

The Story of the Khartum's Colorful Ritualistic Unit. 2018

The primary purpose of the Ritualistic Unit is to provide ritualistic work of the highest standard at Khartum's Ceremonials. And for the past 55 years a dedicated group of approximately 30 Nobles has performed this colorful pageant at every Ceremonial. Each cast member is in full costume and the cast is assisted by the "greatest music this side of heaven", provided by the musicians of the Oriental Band. All this to depict the journey across the hot sands of the desert for a figurative visit to sacred Mecca seeking guidance from the Mystic Shrine for the New Novices.

Noble Ross Johnston, the Unit's Archivist, poet and active Unit member since 1968, in his 50 year history of the Unit wrote that on June 12th, 1963 the Unit was officially declared by Illustrious Sir Syd W. Foreman as "Ritualistic Divan of Khartum Temple". In order to remove the word Divan from the Ceremonial group, we learned that around 1968 the name naturally evolved into "Ritualistic Unit."

Noble Ross Johnston's historical report tells us that the first Ceremonial was presented at the Lakehead on September 7th, 1963. The second performance took place on October 17th, 1963 at the Old Winnipeg Auditorium, now known as the Archives Building. Over the years, the Unit visited and participated in Ceremonials in Thunder Bay, Ontario, Brandon, Manitoba and took an active role in the Mid Western Summer sessions in Winnipeg.

It would appear that this original group were really into performing and in 1968 on December 7th the Unit presented a light-hearted musical version of Charles Dickens "A Christmas Carol - Mr. Scrooge", for 3 performances at the Playhouse Theater.

In the days of Shrine Circuses, Unit members were very active in the control and sales of Circus programs and also guided wheel chair patients.

Unit members continue to be active on numerous Khartum Committees and clubs. Noble Doug McKechnie is the current elected Chief Rabban on the Divan. Several years ago Noble Allan Cantor volunteered his talent and expertise to resurrect the Khartum Khronicle. As editor he published the Khronicle in black and white and later in full color and also pioneered the electronic publication. Noble Bob James has served as a Past Chairman of the Khartum's Shrine Burn Unit.



Over the years our membership has included two Past Grand Masters of the Lodge of Manitoba, M. W. Brother Lew Beckstead and M. W. Brother Arnold Packer and two Past Potentates of Khartum, Illustrious Sir Harold Thom and Illustrious Sir Tom Sidebottom. .

Unit members continue to be justly proud of our members that have provided leadership to numerous service clubs in Winnipeg in addition to the Shrine and to their business enterprises. On August 8th, 2012 the local paper in St. Vital published a full page picture of Tom Sidebottom, with two captions , "Tom Sidebottom will be immortalized with a St. Vital Street in his name", and "Community



builder Sidebottom honored by Street bearing his name, **SIDEBOTTOM DRIVE**". At the time of that publication, the late Illustrious Sir Tom was an active member of the Ritualistic Unit.

This is a very short historical story of Khartum's Ritualistic Unit, highlighting a few significant dates and events and recognizing several of our Unit Nobles. The successes of the Unit can be attributed to the fact that every regular meeting on the fourth Monday in the eight months of our regular activities are conducted in Masonic harmony and friendship, with a warm welcome to any Noble wishing to attend.

Today the Unit is carrying on with the noble traditions of the past under the direction of our young, energetic President Noble Israel Kuwonu. One result of his vision in action is that now Nobles from Sioux Lookout, Ontario are able to attend regular meetings via electronic media. In fact the Unit secretary, Noble Greg Ward the current elected unit secretary, records the minutes and conducts his secretarial duties right from Sioux Lookout. In addition four Nobles from Sioux Lookout are paid up Ritualistic Unit members and are also able to participate at all regular meetings in sync with the the Nobles in Winnipeg.

At the regular Monday May 28th meeting, a motion was presented by our President, "that in view Noble Arnold Packers health restrictions make it is almost impossible for him to attend meetings on a regular basis and that in view of his distinguished service to Freemasonry in general and to our Unit in particular that Noble Arnold Packer, P. G. M. should be made an honorary member of the Ritualistic Unit". The motion passed unanimously. *(See picture above)*

To mark the occasion Noble Allan Cantor prepared a suitable document for presentation. On Monday June 25th, Noble President Israel Kuwonu, Noble Allan Cantor Noble Bob James, Noble Norm Pohl, visited Noble Arnold Noble in the 2nd floor dining room of Simkin Center, at Number 1 Falcon Ridge Road and formally presented his honorary membership designation.

The Khartum Ritualistic Unit continues to look forward to presenting the next Ceremonial to Khartum's new Novices.

News on Fundraising

In April, the Circle of Friends Brunch raised about \$4069.00 for First Lady Judy's fundraiser, Pawz for Kids. A cheque was presented to the Montreal Shriners Hospital for the Dog Therapy Program. At the Dryden Ladies Night event, the Dryden Shriners contributed \$100.00 towards Pawz for kids.

The Bay Giving cards raised \$750 and because Khartum raised more funds than any other participants, a further \$643.50 was donated by The Bay. These funds went directly to the Montreal Shriners Hospital.

MEET YOUR ASSISTANT RABAN, Noble Allan and Lady Carol Hadley

Allan joined the Khartum Shrine in 1974 and became a member of the Pipes and Drums unit in January of 1975. He began by playing the tenor drum, but his interest was with the bagpipes and he started to teach himself to play and with the assistance of some tutors he became proficient enough to move to the pipe section. He played with the band until May of 1982 when health issues prevented him from continuing. Noble Allan was appointed to the Divan in 2016 and is presently Assistant Rabban. After an invitation to be a guest rider with the Ruff Riders in the Mid West Shrine parade in Minneapolis he decided to join the Unit.

Allan became a Mason in 1971 when he joined Red River Lodge No. 172 and served as their Worshipful Master in 1982. He is a Charter member of Corinthian Lodge No. 178 serving as their

first Worshipful Master in 1983, 1984 and 2006. He served as the Lodge secretary 1985/1986. He was District Deputy Grand Master of the Thirteenth Masonic District in 1990-91 and was appointed to the Board of General Purposes Library and Archives Committee for 1992-94 and is currently the Grand Representative for the Grand Lodge of Texas. In June 2009 he was elected as Junior Grand Warden, beginning his journey to the Grand East and was Grand Master in 2012 - 2013.

He joined St. John's Chapter No. 14, Royal Arch Masons in 1973, was the Chapter Scribe E in 1974/75 and was their First Principal in 1978. In 1981 he was appointed Grand Senior Sojourner of the Grand Chapter of Manitoba and in 1982 was elected Grand Registrar. In 1981 he was appointed as the Grand Representative for the Supreme Grand Chapter of India. In 1983 he was Anointed and Consecrated into the Order of the High Priesthood. And is currently the President. He was elected as the Grand Third Principal of the Grand Chapter of Manitoba in 2014, Grand Second Principal in 2015 and Grand First Principal in 2016.

In 1974 Noble Hadley joined King Edward Preceptory, Knights Templar and is currently serving as the Presiding Preceptor.

In 2004 Noble Allan joined Scottish Rite and served as the Thrice Puissant Grand Master for Winnipeg Lodge of Perfection in 2009, Commander in Chief of the Manitoba Sovereign Consistory for 2013, and the Most Wise Sovereign of Bethesda Chapter Rose Croix in 2017. He was Coroneted an Honourary Inspector General 33° in September 2013 and Crowned a Sovereign Grand Inspector General and Active Member of Supreme Council in 2014.

Noble Hadley was accepted into the Royal Order of Scotland in 2006 and has served as Provincial Grand Guarder of the Provincial Grand Lodge of Manitoba.

In 2011 Noble Hadley became a member of Cyrus Council #2 Royal and Select Masters Cryptic Rite, is currently Deputy Master; Winnipeg Conclave #4 Order of the Secret Monitor, or Brotherhood of David and Jonathan, and Keystone Council #172, Allied Masonic Degrees where he was the Sovereign Master





2016/17. In 2012 Comp. Hadley was Admitted, Received, Constituted and Installed a Knight Companion of the Red Cross of Constantine Selkirk Conclave #6, and in 2013 became a member of Prairie Crocus York Rite Sovereign College. In 2016 he became a member of the Commemorative Order of St. Thomas of Acon.

Noble Allan Hadley was born in Winnipeg, May 23, 1946. He graduated from Glenlawn Collegiate Institute in 1965 and immediately started employment with Manitoba Hydro. During his working career Noble Hadley enrolled in several programs at the University of Winnipeg Continuing Education Department where he

earned certificates in Administrative Management; Records and

Information Management; and Office Computer Operations. While a student at the U. of W., Noble Hadley was appointed to an AD HOC committee as a student representative to review the operations of the Department of Continuing Education. After a 37-year career with Manitoba Hydro he retired in 2002. In retirement he has turned his love of golf and his skills as a clubmaker into a secondary career as a golf club technician at a local golf retail store.

Noble Allan met Carol Agerbak and they were married September 26, 1970. They have been blessed with two sons, Christian (Jessica) and Grandson Finnian (July 2013) and Leslie (Dyan) and Grandsons Connor (November 2011) and Nolan (September 2014). He and Lady Carol enjoy attending family events and include soccer games, swimming lessons and watching the grandsons grow up.

Noble Hadley is a member of The Order of the Eastern Star and served as Worthy Patron in 1974. He also had 15 years of service with Scouts Canada in various capacities and was awarded the Medal for Good Service in 1993. Noble Hadley is a member of the Royal Canadian Legion and The Hong Kong Veterans Commemorative Association of Canada. He has served on the Board of Governors of the Breezy Bend Golf and Country Club in Winnipeg and is a Past President.

Lady Carol was responsible for Noble Allan's masonic life as her family was very involved. Her grandfather and father (both deceased) were Masons and Shriners with her brother Bill, Provincial Master Councillor Order of DeMolay hosting the First All Canada Conclave in Winnipeg. As a young girl she was active in Job's Daughters and a member of the Heather Belle's Pipe Band. Lady Carol is a member of the Order of the Eastern Star serving as Worthy Matron in 1985 in Rainbow Chapter #63 and currently an active member of Queen Winnipeg Chapter #1.

She is Past President of Khartum Ladies Auxiliary and a member of Sphinx Temple No. 116 Daughters of the Nile where she belongs to Ilderim's Harem Dance and Pageantry and Klassie Klowns.

Lady Carol retired from Manitoba Hydro in 2006 and has been active in volunteer work with her Church (receiving a certificate from the Province of Manitoba), Breezy Bend Golf Club serving as President for the Ladies section. She served many executive positions and President for 8 terms of the Royal Canadian Legion Ladies Auxiliary Br. #100 and is presently Membership Chair, Acting Secretary and Auditor. She held executive positions in Scouts Canada over 17 years receiving the Medal for Good Service in 1993.

Lady Carol's father, Noble Borge Agerbak (deceased), was part of the Canadian Contingent that was sent to



Hong Kong in WWII and he was a Prisoner of War for almost 4 years. As an associate member for several decades of the Hong Kong Veteran's Association, she was asked to be Secretary and Newsletter Editor for the Manitoba Branch when their members were unable to continue. Upon learning that the Hong Kong Veterans' Commemorative Association (HKVCA) was being formed, in August 1995, she became involved. For the last 23 years, she has been Secretary of Manitoba Region, Chair of the Education Committee in Manitoba and is currently Prairie Regional Director and member of the HKVCA Board of Directors. Nationally she served as editor of WASURERU-NAI, the National newsletter 2006 – 2014; President from 2001 - 2007 and chaired the Memorial Wall Committee from 2007 until completion and dedication in Ottawa 2010.
