

Shrine activities be it at the Temple, Club, Unit, or individual level, so please provide your support in 2009.

I was pleased and proud to represent our fraternity as your Potentate at the opening of the new Shriners Hospital Satellite Clinic in Winnipeg on January 30, 2009. The clinic will operate out of the Children's Rehabilitation Hospital (our old Shrine Hospital) one day a month and is a partnership in conjunction with Khartum Shrine: the Rehabilitation Centre for Children; the Shriners Hospital, Canada, in Montreal; and the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority. It will be conducting initial assessments of patients as well as follow-up assessments after treatment at Shriners in Montreal. I thank Noble Craig Houston for his perseverance over the last ten years to bring this clinic to Winnipeg.

On another note, we, as members of this great fraternal organization, must do everything we can to bring in new members. Khartum has been on a steady decline in membership since the '70s and each of us, as a member of Khartum, has a duty to help Khartum grow. As Shrine Masons, we know that the only place we can get members is from the Masonic lodges that we attend. I am asking each of you to talk to the members of your lodge who are not Shriners to see if they would be interested in joining, or talk to your Worshipful Master about having our membership committee make a presentation during your repast after lodge. As Masons, we must work at bringing new candidates, good men, into the Craft. Remember, the more members in Lodge, the better the opportunity of getting new members in the Shrine. The amnesty program for nobles who have been suspended for non-payment of dues has been extended into 2009. If you are a member in good standing of a Masonic Lodge, you are eligible to rejoin Khartum Shrine by paying your current year's dues. There is also a top line signer's incentive for top line signers of three or more candidates. In addition, we have waved the dues for candidates joining in 2009; candidates will only have to pay for their fez and per capita costs (\$175.00).

This year, the Midwest Summer Session will be held in Rochester, Minnesota, August 20, 21, and 22. ## **Burn Awareness 2009**

Gasoline has only one use – to fuel an engine. Any other use is misuse.



The 2009 Burn Awareness campaign again features the popular character, Anthony the Fire Ant! Anthony is featured in the coloring book, as well as on posters, stickers and other materials that are available for order through www.burnawarenessweek.org.

Shriners Hospitals for Children has treated more than 800 children since 2002 for acute burns caused by ignition of a highly flammable material, such as gasoline. More than 200 of these children were under age 7, and 584 were in the "tweens" and teens category – ages 8-18. Kids ages 13 and older are in the highest at-risk group for gasoline and other flammable substance burns.

Gasoline is a necessary part of our everyday lives. Without it, we'd be unable to get to and from work; our store shelves would be empty; our lawn mowers would be idle.

While gasoline is important, it also can be very dangerous. Its fumes can quickly ignite, causing serious injury or death. "Gasoline has only one use—to fuel an engine. Any other use is misuse" is the theme of Shriners Hospitals for Children's 2009 Burn Awareness campaign.

Feb. 1-7, 2009, is Burn Awareness Week, and Shriners Hospitals for Children will use this week to kick off a year-long campaign focused on preventing gasoline burn injuries.

Preventing burn injuries and burn awareness education should be an ongoing effort, not just a week-long campaign. Shriners are encouraged to share gasoline burn prevention messages throughout 2009 using materials developed specifically for this effort.

Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children have been participating in Burn Awareness Week for almost 20 years, and the 2009 campaign will use a multimedia approach, encompassing print, broadcast and online resources in order to reach as many people as possible with this important information.

A coloring book, classroom lessons, posters, stickers, pens and other materials are available to order at www.burnawarenessweek.org. A video is also available that features the story of a Shriners Hospitals for Children patient, Austin Bailiff.

Austin, 16, of Cashmere, Wash., knows first-hand the dangers of playing with gasoline. One day in March 2006, Austin and a friend were "bored." Looking for something to do, they found an old work glove, and wondered if motor oil would ignite the glove. When it didn't, they poured gasoline into the glove and set it on fire. What they didn't realize before pouring gasoline into the glove was that a small tag inside the glove actually had caught on fire during their first attempt with motor oil.

Before both teens knew what hit them, the gasoline fumes ignited, covering Austin and burning 90 percent of his body. The doctors who initially treated him gave him a 10 percent chance for survival.

Luckily, the Bailiff family found Shriners Hospitals for Children — Northern California, where Austin continues to receive care. His story is featured in the video, which targets teen audiences, and is available through the Web site.



## In Memoriam

Terry McGuire, Deputy Imperial Potentate



Terry McGuire, Deputy Imperial Potentate for Shriners International, passed away on Sunday, January 11, after a brief illness.

McGuire was serving his tenth year as a member of the Boards of Directors for Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. McGuire was re-elected in 2008 during the Shriners' annual Imperial Council Session. As Deputy Imperial Potentate, he was a part of the 13-member body that helps govern the Shriners fraternity. He was also an emeritus member of the Houston Shriners Hospital Board of Governors and treasurer and chairman of the Finance Committee.

McGuire was raised a Master Mason in 1959 and was a member of Triune Lodge #15, where is also served as Worshipful Master. He was Past Potentate of Alzafar Shriners and served as president of the Mounted Horse Patrol and the Alzafar Golf Unit. He also served as District Deputy Grand Master in 2000 and was a member of the Scottish Rite and a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor. He also was a member of the York Rite. For the last 35 years, McGuire served as a representative to the Imperial Council. He also served as chairman of the Dispensations and Charters Committee, and as vice-chairman

of the Imperial Marshal Aides Committee. In 2008, he was invited into membership in St. Anthony Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine and received his 50-year pin from the Grand Lodge of Texas.

McGuire was director of marketing and facility planner for one of the oldest and largest architectural firms in San Antonio, specializing in education and health care facilities. Previously, he spent 28 years in public school administration, where he was assistant superintendent for the eighth-largest school district in Texas. McGuire served as a board member of the Northwest YMCA; was a member of the San Antonio Executive Association and the Harp and Shamrock Society; and a life-member of the San Antonio Livestock Association.

Visitation was on Wednesday, January 14 from 6 P.M. to 8 P.M. at Porter Loring North Funeral Home at 2102 North Loop- 1604 East © Gold Canyon Drive in San Antonio, Texas. A church funeral service was held on Thursday, January 15 at 10:30 A.M. at the Oxford Methodist Church at 9655 Huebner Road in San Antonio, Texas. Internment followed at Mission North Cemetery immediately following the service.

# Hospital Report

he year started off quite briskly for patients attending Shriners Hospitals for Children's clinics at Montreal, Minneapolis, Chicago, and our new satellite clinic.

We had nineteen patient visits in January, including two new patients, and twenty-one patient visits in February, bringing the total to forty as of the end of February. Our expenses are about\$12,000 to date.

Following are my reports on the patients' Christmas party and two major happenings in January.





### Patients' Christmas Lunch With Santa

The Past Potentates of Khartum Shrine held a Lunch with Santa for the Khartum Hospital patients and their families on Saturday, December 6, 2008,

and this proved to be a great success.



More than thirty patients attended along with their siblings and parents or guardians, totaling around eighty kids and fifty parents/guardians.

Unit in Minneapolis MN for most of his life, having gone through various treatments and surgeries for club feet. Bryce gave a vivid account of his latest surgery in Twin Cities, together with a power point presentation, and for an eight year old, it sure was good to hear and see his experiences.

Shealon, who has been with us for

over a year now, is eighteen years of age, and is attending Shriners Hospitals for Children, Spinal Chord Injuries Unit in Chicago. Shealon is paralyzed from the waist down due to being involved in an automobile accident which did tremendous damage to her spine and other internal organs.

Shealon related her experiences throughout the accident, at Hospitals in

Winnipeg, and various other treatment centers, and, of course, her main experience with Shriners Hospitals for Children. She praised the efforts of the medical and support staff at the Spinal Chord Injuries Unit in Chicago in their quest to assist Shealon to lead a better quality of life despite her handicap. She touched on many of the treatments she had received and how this had helped her gain a better attitude to her situation, knowing she was in good hands at Shriners Hospitals for Children.

It was fitting that one of her therapists at Shriners Hospitals for Children was our next speaker and the visit here was a sort of "family" reunion, Shealon and her family together with a new found family with Bryce and his parents.

Sara Klaas, Executive Director of Physiotherapy at Shriners Hospitals for Children, Spinal Chord Injuries Unit, Chicago, spoke on the various scenarios of Shriners Hospitals for Children in Chicago, touching on programs provided by the hospital for patients with varied spinal chord injuries and some of the equipment being used for that purpose.

A couple of the programs that Sara touched on:

Scuba diving training and patients taking part in scuba diving in the ocean. As I reported in my Hospital report at a recent stated meeting, a group of therapists and professional scuba divers take these patients to the Cayman Islands for a week and teach them the art of scuba diving.

There are no family members with them and over and above scuba diving instructors and medical professionals, they learn to be self sufficient as well as getting a lot of therapy. There is no cost to the patient, the families, or the Hospital. The group takes care of all the expenses. Shealon was one of those participants and she enjoys telling about her experiences on this trip.

Another relatively new program on which the hospital has embarked (sorry, but I forget the name of it) is a stand which vibrates and tones the unused lower muscles of the patient, and could bring some level of feeling back into the paralyzed limbs. The cost

Another Khartum patient, Afzal, is due to return to Shriners Hospitals for Children, Chicago, on February 9, 2009, to take part in a two-week stint on this apparatus. We are eagerly awaiting the results.

The following morning, Sunday, before leaving to return to Chicago, Sara spoke to several nobles attending a membership seminar at Shrine House on Wilkes Avenue, and touched on some other new programs as well as the old ones to the gathering. Many questions were asked by the group.

All in all, it was a worthwhile Hospital presentation and I am sure all who witnessed it left with a further knowledge of the small miracles that happen every day at Shriners Hospitals for Children.

## Grand Opening of Shriners Hospitals for Children Satellite Orthopedic Clinic, Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada

Many Shriners and guests were on hand at the Rehabilitation Centre for Children, 633 Wellington Crescent, Winnipeg, (the old Shriners Hospital for Children, Winnipeg) on Friday, January 30, 2009, to witness the official opening (the first in North America and in all of Shrinedom) of the Winnipeg Shrine Satellite Clinic.

In my books, this has been a project that I called for and worked on as far

back as 1996/1998, and after repeated years of lobbying, and then with the assistance of Dr. Fassier, Chief of Staff at Shriners Hospitals for Children, Canada, and Gary Morrison, Chairman of the Board of Governors, Shriners Hospitals for Children, Canada, over the past two years, we have finally come to the time when we will see the Satellite Clinic functioning in Winnipeg, albeit within the hallowed walls of our late Shriners Hospital for Children in Winnipeg which was closed in 1977.

The clinic will operate under the auspices of Shriners Hospitals for Children, Canada; the Rehabilitation Centre for Children, Winnipeg; the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority; and Khartum Shriners; with the purpose of the clinic being to evaluate children referred from Manitoba, Northwest Ontario, Saskatchewan, and Nunavut to Shriners Hospitals for Children, to determine whether they can be treated in Winnipeg or whether they need to be seen at Shriners Hospitals for Children, Canada, in Montreal for specialized orthopedic care.

The new Shriners satellite clinic is one of fourteen clinics available at the Rehabilitation Centre for Children with special needs. In the first year, the clinic will function as a pilot project operating a half day per month approximately ten times a year.

The clinic, although operated under the auspices of Shriners Hospitals for Children, will be staffed by orthopedic surgeons credentialed in both the Shriners and the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority's system.

According to Dr. Brian Postl, President and CEO of the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority, any child who can be seen and treated here at home will be, but those who would benefit from specialized care in Montreal will get that type of care. Many families will benefit from being able to get follow-up care they need in Winnipeg, after they've had surgery in Montreal.

All costs related to the clinic will be covered by Shriners Hospitals for Children, Canada.

This satellite clinic will save transportation costs by Khartum and Wa Wa Shriners and more importantly, we will be able to help more patients from these areas as well as reduce the stress, travel, and time away from home, school, and work for these families.

Khartum Shriners will provide support for this clinic in the form of fundraising, volunteers, and publicity, and generally providing the same measure of input as is in place now in sending the children to Shriners Hospitals for Children, Canada, in Montreal and other hospitals.

Dr. Susan Thompson, orthopedic surgeon, Rehabilitation Centre for Children, will be the doctor in charge of the clinic and will coordinate with the medical staff at Shriners Hospitals for Children, Canada, in Montreal. Dr. Susan trained at Shriners Hospital in Montreal and is pretty well versed in its operation.

Canada, while Dr. Jack McPherson explained the role of Children's Hospital.



Have a happy, safe, and sun-Shrining summer.








# Lake of the Woods Shrine Club

Our camera man extraordinaire, Noble John Machowski, took the picture of Nobles Gerry, Don and Wayne with the Calliope.


Our first meeting was held on January 14, 2009 and those who attended, enjoyed a scrumptious meal prepared by Noble Don Klassen.




