Comments regarding the Khronicle are always welcome!



im Cain of Nashville, Tennessee, is currently serving his 11th year as a member of the Boards of Directors for Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children. Cain was elected Imperial Potentate, part of the 12-member body that helps govern the Shriners fraternity, during the Shriners' 2018 Imperial Session – held in Daytona Beach, Florida, July 15 – July 19.

During his years as a member of the Board of Directors, he has served as chairman of the following committees: Salary, Personnel & Retirement; Planning; Clinical and Basic Research; Medical Affairs; Informational Services; Revenue Cycle; Fraternal Strategic Planning; Insurance; Oversight; Special Purpose Funds/Fundraising Evaluation; Time and Place; Emblems, Regalia and Jewels. He has also served on the Public Relations; Corporate Compliance; Budget; Investments; Masonic Relations; DeMolay; Mileage and Per Diem; and Protocol and Resolutions committees. In addition, he has been the Liaison Officer to the Boston, Cincinnati, Shreveport, Springfield and Tampa Boards of Governors for Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Cain was raised a Master Mason in John B. Garrett Lodge #711 in Nashville, and is a member of the Scottish Rite, York Rite, Quetzalcoatl and Royal Order of Scotland. He has been a member of Al Menah Shriners in Nashville since 1995, and served as Potentate in 2006.

Cain has held several positions within his temple, including Captain of the Motor Corps, Membership Committee Divan Liaison, and Chairman of both the Ringmasters Club and the Business Owner's Group. Cain was a member of Al Menah's Shriners Leadership Team from 2002 to 2006 and assisted in raising more than \$5 million for Shriners Hospitals for Children. He was also a charter member of the Tennessee East-West Football Classic Committee.

Cain served as President of the Tennessee Shrine Association in 2006, is a past Raban of Hillbilly Clan #151, and a life-member of the Cabiri Association. He is an associate member of Rizpah Shriners in Madisonville, Kentucky, El Hasa Shriners in Ashland, Kentucky, and Jericho Shriners in Kingsport, Tennessee. Cain was awarded the Honorary DeMolay Legion of Honor.

A former locomotive engineer, Cain worked for CSX Transportation for more than 42 years. He was a Community Affairs and Safety Officer, and a board member of the Tennessee Railroad Association. Cain spent three years as state coordinator of Tennessee Operation Lifesaver Inc., a nationally recognized program that educates the public about dangers at railroad grade crossings and around railroad properties. He also served as chairman of the board for Alabama Operation Lifesaver Inc. and Tennessee Operation Lifesaver Inc.

Cain and his wife, Patsy, celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary in August 2017. They have two children, Janice and Jim Jr., and two grandchildren, Oakley and Paxton. Cain attends Forest Hills Baptist Church in Nashville.

Recorder's Message

reeting Nobles and Ladies of Khartum Shriners: Did you know that any Noble can become a 'Hospital Permanent Contributing Member'? Currently every Noble that joins the Shriners pays \$5.00 US every year besides their Temple Dues as their Hospital levv. One can just pay a one-time amount of \$150.00 US or \$195.00 Can. and become a Hospital Permanent Contributing Member and in doing so will receive a certificate to indicate your contribution and then be exempt from any further hospital levy. A Noble may become a Permanent Per Capita Member. Currently amount one pays to Imperial for per capita fees = \$30.00 US or \$39.00 Can. If you so wish you could make one payment of 30 times the per capita fees and become a Permanent Per Capita Member which works out to \$1170.00 Can.

A Noble can also become a Life Member of Khartum Shriners. For those Nobles that are under 65 years of age, you just have to make one payment of 20 times your current years dues which works out to \$4,780.00 and if you are over 65 years, then it is only 10 times the current years dues or \$1392.00. This is something to think about with everything going up these days. When the Per Capita Fees were increased a few years ago, Imperial offered Nobles an opportunity to become a Permanent Member and many Nobles took that advantage. Something to think about.

For those new Nobles that have joined Khartum and have joined a Unit or Club and are thinking about participating in parades and Stated Meetings/functions, it would be nice to have your Fez indicate which Unit/Club you belong to. Currently Khartum gets the lettering done with a company in the USA and it might take 4 to 6 weeks to get the work done. The cost is \$5.00 per letter removed & attached plus shipping in US Funds. Currently the office ships from the US and it is shipped back to the address we provide in the US. The company wishes that the office controls the

work orders and payments, so consider this before the summer parade season.

When I attended the Recorder's Seminar in the latter part of February, I was informed by Imperial legal and financial departments that all Shrine Unit/Club fundraising events have to be first approved by the Potentate to make sure they fall under charitable or fraternal guidelines. The office requires that copies of tickets be submitted with the application for approval for our file and so that we can check if they properly comply with Imperial Guidelines so that the money you might have raised for Fraternal does not have to go to Charitable because of some small incorrect wording or picture.

This past while, I have been asked about the status of Nobles attending meetings and functions and now I have the answer for you. Under section 339.1 of the Imperial Shrine Bylaws it states, "A Noble may not be admitted to his own or any other temple, unless he exhibits to the temple to which he desires admittance an official Shrine card for the then current year". The Legal department at Imperial indicates this means 'all Shrine functions' other than fundraising events. So, to attend your Unit meetings, Stated Meetings and parades, either civil or strictly Shrine parades. a Noble must be current in his dues. When a Noble participates in any parade he has to have a current dues card so that he is covered by the Temple's Insurance Policy.

At present I am trying to be in the office Tuesdays to Thursdays so if you need any information of me, I will try to find it for you; but please understand I am still learning this job and if it is not for the excellent office staff we have, I would be lost.

So, until next time as we say in a Masonic Lodge.... "Happy to Meet, Sorry to part, Happy to meet again!"

Each Point is worth a percentage (total 40%)

If at the end of December, a Noble in good standing has participated in any of the above, he will be entitled to the equal percentage reimbursement of his hotel room cost in or equal to currency paid from the Summer MSA Session. (Keep room receipts as this will be required for reimbursement)

Each Unit who brings a Parade Unit and participates in the parade at the MSA will be able to charge .22 cents per km from the Temple (Quickest route on Google Map) in Canadian Funds providing more than one Noble is travelling together in the vehicle. This will be paid after proof of attendance of the summer session and the appropriate reimbursement form has been filled out and submitted for approval by the Potentate & Recorder.

This will be reviewed annually if budget funding is available.

Hospital Report

By Illustrious Sir Don Thomson [PP] Khartum Hospital Chairman



Greetings Nobles and Ladies;

our Khartum Shrine Patient Transportation Portfolio had a very busy 2018. In 2018 Khartum provided for 89 children to attend 248 patient visits at a cost of about \$224,250.00 this included 2 air ambulance flights of approximately \$15,000.00 ea. Of our patient visits, 85 were from Lake Head SC (78 TC & 7 Can), 3 - Dryden (Can), 1 - Sioux Lookout (Can), 14 - Lake of the Woods (Can), 114 - Winnipeg and area (67 TC, 43 Can, 1 Chi, 3 Phi), 3 Interlake SC (Can) 10 - Selkirk SC (7 TC, 3 Can), 11 - Brandon SC (5 TC, 6 Can) and 6 Pembina Valley (Can). Of these patient visits 157 went to Twin Cities, 86 went to Montreal, 3 to Philadelphia and 1 to Chicago. This includes the 13 new patients Khartum added to the patient transportation portfolio in 2018; however of the 13 new patients 7 went to SHC® Canada and 6 to SHC® Twin Cities.

Statistics for the Shriners Hospitals for Children® - Canada for 2018 were; overall surgeries performed (inpatient discharges and outpatient surgeries), their target was to reach 950 surgeries by year-end but they performed 1181 in comparison to 1073 in 2017, that's 124.3% of the goal achieved. In addition, it is interesting to note that 47% of the surgeries are performed as Day Surgeries which do not require Regarding referrals, hospitalization. Canada received an all-time high of new patient referrals 5046 which is 107% of the 2018 target of 4725. The hospital is adapting with an increased number of Outpatient clinics thanks to the addition of new orthopedic surgeon Thierry Pauyo as well as nurse practitioner Marie-Josée Beaulieu. Shriners Hospital for Children®- Canada is the 3rd busiest Shrine Hospital behind Mexico and Northern California.

In a constant effort to improve the quality of services, your Shriners Hospital for Children® Canada has teamed up with Press Ganey Associates Inc., who survey patients and their families about the quality of care and services that provided. On November 13, our inpatient team received the 2018 Press Ganey Guardian of Excellence Award for achieving and sustaining excellence. Big Wheels Keep on Turning
Lady Brenda McKechnie's program for
2019 is aimed at raising funds for
specialized wheelchairs for Shriners
Hospitals for Children® - Canada. Each
wheelchair costs about \$5000.00. At
the February Board of Governors
meeting I had the privilege of
presenting a check to the Dave
Merrett Chairman of the Board of
Governors SHC® Canada for \$900.00
to kick start this program. These funds
collected in January and February
were from the Divan Ladies and the
Lakehead Shrine Club members.



This past year there were some changes made to your Twin Cities Hospital. This facility is no longer recognized as a Shriners Hospital for Children®-Twin Cities; it is now referred to as Shriners Healthcare for Children-Twin Cities. The facility (bricks and mortar) is still in use. This new care model includes the current out-patient clinic services: visits, physician radiology, rehabilitation, orthotics and prosthetics. The Chief of Staff, Dr. Cary Melke has been transferred to Shriners Hospital for Children® Shreveport. Surgeries are now conducted at the Gillette Children's Specialty Healthcare in St Paul by the SHC® Twin Cities surgeons. We are not merging or affiliating with Gillette, Shriners have an agreement for our surgeons to use their Operating Room and Inpatient Care Unit. Our patients from Manitoba and Northwest Ontario will be sent to Shriners Hospital for Children® Canada or another Shrine Hospital for their surgeries depending on the circumstances. Over

the last 3 months 4 patients have been referred to SHC® Canada from Twin Cities.

In the future the SHC® Twin Cities Clinic will move to a different well-equipped and appropriately sized site in the Twin Cities Metro Area where outpatient services will continue to be provided. In addition the new model is intended to help more children in more places with the use of Telehealth and offsite outreach clinics.

In addition to the changes to Twin Cities SHC®, Tampa has also downsized to an Outpatient Clinic, Boston has shrunk their operation to 2 floors in their current facility and are looking at selling the building and leasing back space. The other option being looked at is to keep the building and lease out the extra space. There are 2 other hospitals that are also under review, Cincinnati and Portland.

At the recent MSA meetings we were advised changes are being done in an effort to;

- Transform our delivery of care,
- Reshape access to Pediatric Care,
- Renew our commitment to kids around the world
- Evolve the Shriners Hospitals for Children® Healthcare System.

We were also advised that in order to stay the course Shriners must reduce the number of US hospitals in the Shriners Hospitals for Children® system to one to four Centers of Excellence by 2035. As full service facilities, the number of Centers of Excellence will be based upon what we need and what we can afford. These Centers of Excellence will have all needed services such as PICU, research, MRI/CT Scans.

Since its inception in 1922, Shriners Hospitals for Children® has sought to meet the ever-changing pediatric specialty needs of children around the world. From treating polio, to acute pediatric burns, to developing the world's largest pediatric telehealth network, the energizing journey to treating more children in more places continues as we look toward our next 100 years.

This does not include the 74 years before that, which we contributed \$5 - \$10,000 dollars annually directly to the Montreal hospital. We also annually send \$1,000 for deceased members, and \$100.00 to the 100 Million Dollar Club for each new Potentate directly to the Montreal hospital. We annually support the Khartum Khronicle, Circus Daddy/Mom club and prepare goody bags for each new shrine patient. Illustrious Sir Doug, again, 'Thank-you' for hosting KLA today and we look forward to continually raising funds to help Children with disabilities in Khartum's jurisdiction.

he Shrine Fez bearing the name Khartum, so familiar to many people in Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario today, was relatively unknown until 1905 when Khartum Temple was introduced, established and chartered in

Winnipeg, Manitoba, through the efforts of members of the Masonic Order, Scottish and York Rites and the Shrine of North America. Thus, the name "Khartum", taken from the chief city in Sudan, became Temple No. 95 in the Shrine of North America and the fifth temple to be chartered in Canada.

As membership rapidly grew throughout the Shrine of North America, the Imperial Shrine officers recognized that Shriners had to have a mandate that would keep their membership united in a common purpose. Thus, in 1922, was established the <u>Shriners Hospitals for Children</u>, which to this date is known as the "World's Greatest Philanthropy". Its mandate was to set up and maintain a network of hospitals for treating children with orthopedic or burns injuries. In 1923, Khartum Shriners proudly sent their first three patients to the Twin Cities Shrine Hospital for Children for treatment at no cost to the children or their families.

In earlier years, as the membership of Khartum grew, meetings were held at several venues throughout Winnipeg. Before moving into its current premises, the Temple was located in the former Ashdown residence at 529 Wellington Crescent, noted for its prestigious charm, beauty, presence, location and historical significance.

In 1937, Khartum was given jurisdiction over the Lakehead and Northern Ontario areas, which extended the Temple's jurisdiction from the Saskatchewan border to approximately 120 miles east of Thunder Bay.

In 1949, the Winnipeg Unit of Shriners Hospital for Children was built and in operation shortly thereafter. This was the pride of Khartum and was, no doubt, one of the main reasons for its membership growth as loyal and committed members served and supported the Shrine philanthropy. With

the introduction of the Canadian universal medicare system, the Winnipeg Unit of Shriners Hospital for Children was turned over to the Manitoba government in 1977. Khartum also introduced the Stop Burns Injuries Program, which provides fire-

prevention educational services to school children as well as a public service to senior residences and other organizations interested in preventing burns injuries.

Our philanthropy has been further enhanced in Khartum through the recognition of children in need of our services with the introduction of the Khartum Patient Transportation Fund, which is a registered charity. The fund has enabled Khartum to triple its patient load of children requiring and needing our no-cost medical services.

We recognize and proudly salute the support received from our various Shrine units operating out of Winnipeg and our Shrine clubs outside the city. All members of these units and clubs stand proud and tall for the many contributions they make in terms of time, effort and resources to the Shrine of North America and to the communities, towns and cities they represent.

Over the past several years, many <u>fund-raising initiatives</u> have been introduced and well supported by hardworking and committed nobles and their ladies who assist our whole organization to fund general operations and to help children who cannot help themselves.

In 2000, the Temple moved into its new and permanent home at 1155 Wilkes Avenue in Winnipeg, where it services the needs of its members and offers <u>first-class facilities</u> to the public for meetings and other functions and events.

Khartum Shriners and their ladies remain fiercely proud of the contributions and services we provide through our obligations and commitment to what we believe is the "World's Greatest Philanthropy".







All Shriners are Masons, But Not all Masons are Shriners

hriners International is a spin-**J** off from Freemasonry, the oldest, largest and most widely known fraternity in the world. Freemasonry dates back hundreds of years to when stonemasons and Other craftsmen gathered after work in shelter houses, or lodges. Over time, the members organized into Masonic guilds and the tools of their trade - the Square and Compass – became the symbol of their brotherhood.

Over time, Masonry evolved into an organization that began to accept members who were not craftsmen. Today, Masonry is built upon a foundation of improving character and

communities, though the square and compass are still the symbols of the fraternal brotherhood.

When Shriners International was first founded in



Khartum Kowboys

as the Khartum Kowboys unit was formed in 1979 as the Khartum Arabian Horse Guard. It started as a military-style riding unit, using English saddles and riding pure-bred Arabian geldings. We wore red tunics, dark breaches and brown boots like those worn by the RCMP. Our drill team performed maneuvers patterned after the RCMP musical ride. Fortunately, our Ride Master, Doug Britton, was an instructor with the RCMP musical ride. Our drill team competed well against other mounted units in the Midwest Shrine, and we performed for many audiences in Manitoba, at the Manitoba Stampede, St. Amant Centre, Portage Hospital, Riverview, Middlechurch, and Assiniboia Downs.

More recently, we changed to a casual, western-style mounted unit. Our official name change was approved in 2015. Our new riding uniform includes black pants, black cowboy boots, and either a long sleeve western style red shirt with Shrine cresting or a lighter short sleeve blue shirt with Shrine logo. At many events we wear the traditional red Fez. We also received permission to wear black cowboy hats. The 'Kowboy hats' are decorated with Shrine jewels as is on our Fez. In addition, for formal events, we have western-cut sports coats to wear with our black pants and black boots. We now use western saddles, and ride Quarter-horses and other breeds, in addition to the Arabians.

Main activities include local parades, starting with the Chickendaze Parade each spring in Oakbank, the Selkirk parade in July and others depending on availability of our riding members and horses; and trail rides in Birds Hill Park, Spruce Woods, and wherever the Midwest takes us. Some of us also venture farther south to Arizona for the

annual Desert Caballeros Ride where we ride into the mountains out of Wickenburg AZ and camp under the stars for 5 days.

We also attend the Midwest sessions (in the Midwest States, Manitoba and Saskatchewan), participating in the parades, trail rides, and other events and riding in the grand entry at the start of the competitions, although we haven't started a western-style drill team yet.

With the help and guidance of Jim Graham and his assistant Wayne Kramble; our Captain, Doug Collins, recently accomplished his long-standing plan to train his horse to pull a cart, and he now enjoys parades, casual rides and friendly competitions driving his horse-drawn cart. If you are interested, he has room for a passenger.

We currently have 7 regular members and 4 honourary members. Our horses can be stabled wherever the member chooses. Currently our horses are boarded at Ron or Doug's ranch. Both ranches are located north of Oakbank, just east of Birds Hill Park, giving us an easy ride to many trails. Our business meetings are generally held at one of these ranches or occasionally at the Park Ranch restaurant.

Our most recent event was our annual brunch, in December, for our members and their ladies, with a few special quests.

Pohl as a recipient of the prestigious *John Ross Matheson Award* from the Supreme Council of Canada, Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite. reetings from your membership committee, yes we are alive and kicking, but we need your help. Here is OUR story.

Just a short 5 years ago, this Temple had 836 Nobles and at every Stated meeting at every parade or unit event we had Nobles and their ladies come out in droves! Well today just a short few years later we are down to 615 Nobles. You may ask "WHY"! I will tell you some of the reasons and then I will tell you how we can fix it. Honest!

Like all Temples the membership ages and the dreaded Black Camel claims our Nobles at a faster pace each year. Five years ago we lost 39 Nobles in that year, well in 2019 we have already lost 13 Nobles, but we survive. In the membership committee we look at the 3 R's which is RECRUITMENT, RETENTION and RESTORATION.

- Recruitment from Masons in our lodges or from friends who become Masons and then move on to the Shrine. If you go to your lodge and you see a candidate go from the EA to MM degree, do you talk to him about joining the Shrine! In Mb alone 54 candidates have joined a Masonic Lodge since September of 2018, are they members of your lodge? Have you reached out to them to come out to our Shindigs at the Shrine Centre???? Why not become a mentor to the new Mason and introduce him to the fun side of the fraternity. Chat with him and put his name into the beashrinernow.com website in the Shriner village. It is so easy! We will then contact him and invite him down to see the different units and clubs they could be part
- Retention, this is for all of us! We need to bring back the fun into the Shrine. Lets remember why we joined. Yes, to have fun and do fun degrees, playing a musical instrument or dressing as a klown or ride a three wheeled cycle that spurts water at innocent klowns. We need your help to reach out to your members who are not coming out, give them a call, find out why they are no longer coming out and lets change the attitude of the members so they want to be at every event.
- Restoration is the last topic, we have 40+ members who owe back dues for two (2) or more years! Are they members of \underline{YOUR} unit? Have you tried to contact

them to pay their dues or contact the Recorder of the Shrine to see if the Temple can help? If not! Why Not! These Nobles were all contributing members of Khartum, why are we letting them slip into darkness.

So does everyone know that at our December Stated meeting a motion was passed that if you are a Noble over the age of 65, and have been a members for more than five (5) years, you can ask for a reduction in your dues to \$100 plus the Per Capita and Hospital Assessment. Did you also know that if you are a Shriner who is permanently confined to a PCH, Retirement Village or Healthcare facility you can write the Recorder and request to have your Temple portion of the dues reduced to \$25.99 plus the Per Capita and Hospital Assessment. So let's get out there to <u>RESTORE</u> some of our Nobles to become active members again.

Did you also know that those Nobles who are under 65 that owe back dues, can be restored to active status by paying the current year \$184.50 plus the Hospital Assessment of \$12.40 and Per Capita of \$78.60 for the years of 2017/2018 for a grand total of \$275.50. I know you have members in your units that have fallen thru the cracks and may want to come back, well this is their chance to wear the red fez again, it's a great thing to have friends at your side it makes the day go by factor.

So here is the challenge I put to you; we need 50 New Nobles this year, are you up to the challenge of talking with that new EA or MM in your lodge, becoming his mentor and bringing him to the fun side of the fraternity? Ask him what he does in his off time from the lodge, does he play a musical instrument? Does he collect or ride vintage cars? Or does his have a hobby like playing the Kazoo or riding a motorcycle? Come on, help us out, no one person can save Khartum! This is for all of us to step up and go to work.

As brothers we offer each other fraternal affection and respect. Together we will support each other in adherence to this creed, so that we and our communities will be the better because of our fraternity and its principles.

As Shriners we look beyond ourselves to serve the needs of others, especially children who cannot help themselves.

We believe Shriners Hospitals for Children to be the world's greatest philanthropy, and we covenant with each other to support its "temples of mercy" with spirit, time, talent and means.

Shriners' Code of Ethics

he officers and directors of Shriners International, an Iowa corporation, and all who may be elected or appointed to positions of authority, in order to discharge the responsibility bestowed upon them by the Representatives, and to maintain the integrity of the Order, and all Shrine temples, their elected divan members, their appointed officers and all Nobility shall abide by this Code of Ethics.

- a. Obey the law of the land and the articles of incorporation and bylaws of the Order, adhering to the spirit as well as the letter thereof.
- b. Demonstrate the highest standards of personal integrity, truthfulness and honesty in all their fraternal activities; administer the Order's affairs with impartiality, efficiency and effectiveness and in a manner that enhances its good name and mission.
- c. Be certain that their information is accurate when speaking on behalf of the Order; disclose when they are stating their personal opinions; and be scrupulous in the representation of their authority and avoid misleading those with whom they deal.
- d. Approach their organizational and operational duties with a positive attitude and constructively support open communications, creativity, dedication and compassion; bring credit to the Order by their public demeanor; accept as a personal duty the responsibility to remain informed on important and critical issues affecting the Order; and avoid accepting an assignment if they cannot effectively, competently and timely discharge the responsibilities of the assignment.
- e. Exercise their independent judgment in the best interest of the Order, and free of compromising influences and loyalties; and act responsibly in good faith, and in a manner not designed or intended to bring them personal gain from the discharge of their fraternal duties.
- f. Give notice, in a manner consistent with the corporation's bylaws, of any duality of interest or possible conflict of interest and make it a matter of record; give notice of any direct or indirect interest in an individual or organization which is proposing or is involved in a transaction with the Order; and thereafter, refrain from voting on the matter or transaction or otherwise attempting to exert influence over the matter or transaction.

- h. Report the unethical or inappropriate behavior of directors or officers to the board of directors, when informal resolution is not effective.
